Spruce Grove's strong economy and constant development, along with its proximity to large projects in and around the Edmonton Metropolitan Region, give EPC businesses access to both business opportunities and the large pool of talent they need to succeed. All highways lead to Spruce Grove

Spruce Grove sits at the heart of Alberta, connected by main highways, airport and rail to oil fields in the North and large population centres in Southern Alberta and British Columbia, positioning our industrial sector for success.

Spruce Grove's strategic location, location, location

Spruce Grove is not only uniquely situated at the heart of Western Canada, it is tied to B.C. and Southern Alberta via a variety of routes through major centres and beyond.

- A future, dedicated oversize corridor north on Jennifer Heil Way to Yellowhead will make it easier for manufacturers and fabricators to get any product, no matter how big, to market.
- The Yellowhead Highway the northern Trans-Canada highway offers direct access to major resource development areas.
- Canamex Highway a key North American trade corridor links the Edmonton region to the U.S. and Mexico, opening up diverse markets.
- Anthony Henday Drive Edmonton's "ring road" allows easy access to Highway 2 and the Edmonton Metropolitan Region.

Access to diverse transport methods

From land to air, Spruce Grove industrial site offers quick access to move products and people, no matter their transportation needs.

- Quick access to both CN and CP railways and their expanding rail yards. These two Class-1 transcontinental railways and their subsidiaries provide industry with intermodal links to Canada's East and West coasts, major US markets on the Gulf coast, the Mid West and the Northeast and Asia export markets.
- Highway 60 provides a quick, direct route skirting around the city to Edmonton International Airport (YEG) - a full-service cargo airport capable of accommodating the largest cargo aircraft in the world.
- Nearby Highway 44 leads directly to Villeneuve Regional Airport – used by private and corporate aircraft.
