<u>RPB Industries</u>

<u>RPB Industries</u> has moved to their newly constructed facility at 17 Golden Spike Road. A local civil construction company specializing in utility design build, installation, and project management, RPB has been doing business in the Spruce Grove/Edmonton area for 12 years and recently expanded operations to Calgary and Lethbridge. Their Spruce Grove office currently employs 50 people.

To accommodate the growth of their business, owners Ray Peterson & Anita Krahn purchased a 16 acre property at 17 Golden Spike Road. A-3 acre parcel was subdivided out on which RPB's new head office was constructed and at 21,000 SF is twice the size of the former facility. RPB occupies 75% of the building with the remainder for lease. Under their development company, 5 Ply Holdings, the remaining 13 acres will be subdivided to create 6 additional fully-serviced industrial lots, each 1 to 1.5 acres in size. This is a phased project, with the next two lots ready by summer. Build to suit and long term lease options will be available. Plans also include a multi-tenant spec building fronting Golden Spike Road.



Tourism and Hospitality Recovery Program

Canada

<u>Hardest-Hit Business</u> <u>Recovery Program</u>



The Government of Canada is providing support to businesses in the tourism and hospitality industry through the wage and rent subsidy programs, including hotels, travel agencies, restaurants, and others with a subsidy rate of up to 75%.

Canada Worker Lockdown Benefit



This benefit includes workers in regions where provincial or territorial governments have introduced capacitylimiting restrictions of 50% or more. This benefit is available from October 24, 2021, to May 7, 2022.

Alberta Jobs Now Program

The Government of Canada is providing support for businesses and organizations that are not in the tourism and hospitality industry, this recovery program provides support for businesses that have faced deep losses, with a subsidy rate of up to 50%.

<u>Canada Jobs and Growth</u> <u>Fund (JGF)</u>



A \$700M program that supports regional job creation and positions local economies for long-term growth, including \$70M towards businesses and organizations created after January 2020 for those that meet the eligibility criteria.

<u>Canada-AB Job Grant</u> & <u>Work Sharing Program</u>

Canada Local Lockdown Program



Wage and rent support extended for businesses and includes employers subject to capacity-limiting restrictions of 50% or more and reduce current-month revenue decline threshold requirements to 25%. Available from October 24, 2021, to May 7, 2022.

<u>Canada Tourism Relief</u> <u>Fund (TRF)</u>



Funding to help tourism, not-for-profit, and Indigenous businesses adapt their operations to meet public health requirements while investing in products and services to facilitate their future growth.

> <u>Canada Emergency</u> <u>Business Account</u> <u>(CEBA)</u>



Private and non profit businesses can apply for funding to offset the cost of training opportunities. The hiring and training unemployed or underemployed Albertans. The third intake will be announced at a later date.



The Canada Alberta Job Grant offers funding for Work Sharing Program provides EI benefits for employees who share work while their employer recovers.



The repayment deadline for Canada Emergency Business Account loans to qualify for partial loan forgiveness is being extended to December 31, 2023 for eligible borrowers in good standing.
